

Ruminations

It was in the dog days of August, a hot summer day in 1978, and a group of us were crammed into a car heading for Ottawa. The Ontario Track and Field league was winding up at the Provincial Championships. We would be staying at the University of Ottawa residence. Pope Paul VI had died, and the Vatican was in the throes of trying to select a new Bishop of Rome (the official title of the Pope). It was not the primary conversation of young junior athletes heading to another track meet. Field athletes are so much different than track athletes and so loaded with javelins, discuses, shot puts, and my specialty (and I use the term rather loosely), hammers. Back then, the event of hammer was really unknown and probably never seen by 90% of Canadians. That likely holds true to this day, despite the fact that Canadians won the Olympic gold medal in women's and men's hammer. Of course, the death of a Pope makes the news, and so does all the intrigue of the process of electing a new one. As an 18 year old, my only real familiarity with the Pope was standing under his picture on detention at elementary school. The place of penalty was across from the principal's office in full view of his watchful eyes. Apparently, that made me an expert on all things Catholic. Luckily the conversation soon turned to the Canadian track and field stars who would be present at the event. On the way back, adorned with a few medals from the event, we discovered that the Church had a new leader, Pope John Paul I. I have to admit that almost half a century later, with forty years of being immersed in all things Catholic, ok, most things Catholic, I have a better appreciation of the machinations of the events that are about to unfold. I think I still live with a modicum of naivete about the political side of the Church, blissfully so. The media is already posturing and postulating about all things conclave, the front runners, the long shots, the opposing directions and the speculations, and all this before the body of the Pope is even out for public viewing to pay their last respects. remember seeing Pope John Paul 2 at Downsview stadium in 1984. Seeing him might be a stretch. Even with my new glasses for distance, the Pope was nothing more than a blur. Every once in a while, his robes might blow and that was the most exciting part. The future Benedict XVI paid a visit to the seminary and I was able to shake his hand and stumble through a few words in my meager knowledge of German. To be truthful, I had no idea who he was then, and it wasn't until someone reminded me that Pope Benedict had been to the seminary that I recalled that relatively unmemorable day. (That is by no means a commentary on anything but my own unawareness and disinterest in such events. Now if it had been Bobby Orr, or Gaetan Boucher, that would have been a totally different thing. Well after 35 years of priesthood, I'd like to



think I have a better awareness of what I want in a Pope. Let's face it, if the new Pope lasts beyond a decade, this will be my last Pope before retirement. So I am looking for a Pope who will offer us raises, better working conditions, and longer vacations, and definitely a lower retirement age. It would be great to have a Pope who understands true potency and importance of liturgy, recognizes priesthood as relationship, cracks a few jokes, and most importantly, loves Snoopy. I hate breaking in new popes. Rest in peace good and faithful and inspiring servant. Fr. Roy




