Ruminations

I don't think I would characterize myself as a 'denier'. Perhaps 'ignorer' would be better suited. I am not talking politics or woke or anything else that the 'denier' accusation conjurers up, it is all about birthdays. For me, it was the thirtieth birthday that was the crucial date. 


