

Ruminations

After thirty five years of annual priests' retreats, spanning various venues from the now defunct Cranberry Village in Collingwood, or the Holiday Inn in Barrie, to the primitive likes of the Seminary, and now for over two decades the Nottawasaga Inn in Alliston (it seems to be the only facility that can host two weeks of 150 priests per week), certainly the demographics of the clientele have changed drastically. Maybe it was a young priest's thing, but you knew virtually all the priests, and most of the priests had been locally formed. In fact, there was always a rivalry between which Toronto parish had produced the most vocations. I think it was St. Vincent de Paul Parish if I remember correctly. Three decades later, we could host a United Nations convention so international has the priesthood become. Now as ardent a fan I am of my local roots, the exotic factor of Holland Landing just does not compare to the mountains of Kenya, or the jungles of Tanzania, or the lushness of Sri Lanka. This makes sitting down for lunch and dinner guite an adventure. Stories about the beaches of Brazil, or the perils of life in the Congo seem to make the rather pedestrian life in Ontario very small and naïve and insular. And stories of seminaries in Africa, or Poland, or South America or Rome render St. Augustine's Seminary in Scarborough decidedly globally inadequate. Anyway, the very 'catholic' in the truest sense of the world can have its own difficulties when sitting down to dine. I'm not sure if it is an age thing, a hearing thing, or a combination of both, but I am finding it harder to hear through accents, and that this global gathering, there are literally accents from the four corners of the world. It is the particularly heavy accents which just don't translate (pun intended) well through the loud din of the gathering of priests at chatting at the same time. At one of the meals, one of those eclectic table with seven other priests, someone remarked about two of us as being just a handful of priests born locally. I was feeling particularly local having been born half an hour away from the hotel. This sparked a conversation about the old retreats when everyone knew everyone. I think even the priests' personnel director would have a difficult time naming the full roster. Now one of the priests who sat next to me, and to be honest, with the noise volume of the room, even though there may be eight people at table, the truth is, you have two maybe three people with whom you can engage. The other side of the table is just out of range or earshot. So this priest with a heavy accent asked me where I was from, he being from Bangladesh, so I said I was from here. That didn't satisfy him so he repeated asking me where I am really from. Now you have to understand, about 90% of the priests are not from here, so he was more direct about which country was my roots. I said again, I am from here. He seemed a bit perplexed so I tried to explain that my parents were both born in Ontario, and both sets of grandparents were from Ontario, and all four sets of great grandparents were born in Ontario. He seemed to be content with that and replied how interesting that is. Now there was a lot of conversational noise in the room, and his accent was very heavy, so I didn't really hear most of what he was saying, but with a couple of nods of the head, and grunts

of affirmation, and my charming smile, for all intents and purposes, I counted that as a successful interaction. I have always marveled at these priests who leave family and friends, and the familiarity of home with that true missionary spirit. That missionary spirit has never been one of my charisms, and in a few short weeks, it will be exercised in my own life, not by choice but by obedience, as I go to face the wilds of Georgian Bay. (I hope they can understand my 'Landing accent'.
