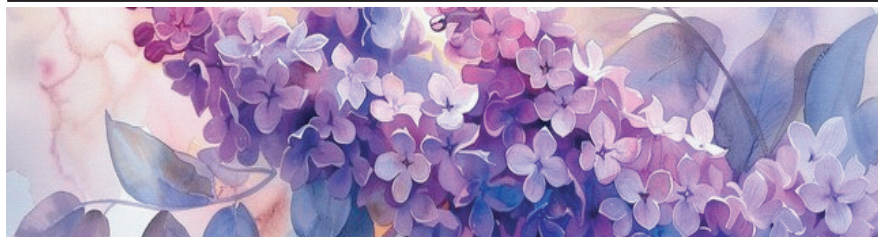

Ruminations

I never met my paternal grandfather, he died a year before my parents got married, and two years before I was born. I bear his name – sort of. A few years ago I received a copy of his baptismal certificate. I always knew his name as Roy Leonard, not sure where my great grandparents got the name, but he was an only child, and there are no other Roys or Leonards in the family tree. It could have been motivated by the tension between the Catholic Irish and Protestant Irish marriage. Anyway, the baptismal certificate indicated that my grandfather was actually named 'Royal'. I really wished that my dad was alive when I found that out because I am sure that my dad never knew that. My grandfather died at the age of 58. Growing up, that seemed like such an old, old age. Note, I may have changed my perception of that age. He did not live long enough to start collecting his Old Age Pension. My dad had been sick with heart disease for over twenty years. His tongue in cheek desire was to live long enough to collect at least one Old Age Pension cheque. On his 64th birthday, we started counting down the months, again tongue in cheek. As that year passed, it began to seem to be a possibility, though he was at a bit of a disadvantage – it happened to be a leap year, so there was an extra day in the way. Alas, as much as we knew that with the nature of his heart problems, it could be a day to day thing, eighty days before the date of starting OAS, he died. For mom, it was eighty-one days short. Oh so close. I remember turning 58, the age at which my grandfather died and taking a gulp and thinking that at least I surpassed his number of days. I could set my target on surpassing dad's age. When it came time to consider starting my Canada Pension Plan (CPP), I opted to start receiving it as soon as I turned 60. I figured with my family history of my grandfather's and my dad's early deaths, I may as well start collecting sooner rather than later. I could have waited and then collected more, but with the calculations it seemed that the advantage of an early start works out better until over the age of 75 so I am hedging my bets in terms of longevity. If my prayers are answered, 'Once Before I Die' for the Stanley Cup, the Leafs should prevail at least before 2035. With all the turmoil surrounding the team after their recent loss, I'm not hedging my bets – it may take that amount of time as it seems we are in another 're-building' phase. At 64, the Government sent out a notice about OAS. It too could be deferred with the bonus of collecting just a bit more if I waited, but I figure a dollar in my account now is better than a dollar and a bit later. I had been looking forward to Canada giving me money for being alive. I have been waiting and watching. I wasn't too sure if they would actually send me a cheque in the mail, so I was a bit more invested in the possibility of the Postal strike than usual, or whether it would be directly deposited into my bank account. I had to keep checking both. At long last, it showed up in my bank account. I have to admit it was great to see, but it was rather un-climactic. My recommendation would be that every first time OAS cheque should be mailed directly to the recipient. It would have been way more fun to arrive in the mailbox. Even the Oscars understand that excitement and anticipation generated by saying 'The Envelope Please.' Oh well, I still plan to do something frivolous and fun with that first pay. Oh the possibilities.

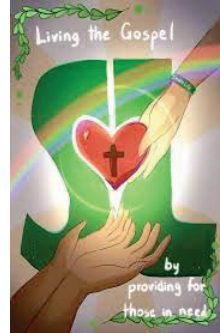
No Coffee Sunday

ShareLife has been an initiative started back in 1976 when the Archbishop withdrew

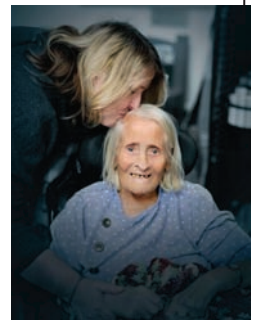

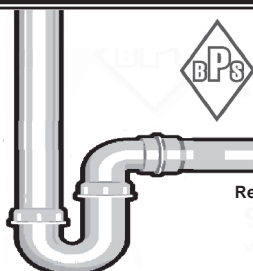

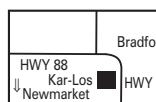
