Reflections

20/20

Summertime is cottage time. It is a good time to get away from the heat in the city. The sight of the serene waters and trees always refreshes weary minds and hearts. Activities in the water and on the trails are fun, too. The time with family members and friends are always life-nourishing. And nothing brings family and friends closer together than a cookout in the patio.

Cookouts with family and friends always remind me of a particular great cookout that happened more than two thousand years ago. This event took place on the shores of Galilee after the death and resurrection of our Lord. This story has a familiar ring to it, echoing events at the begin-ning of Jesus' ministry. Once again, these seasoned fishermen have worked hard and caught nothing. Once again, a stranger tells them where to let down their nets. Once again, they pull in a great catch of fish. Once again, he challenges them to follow him and carry on his mission. No wonder their hearts leap with joy! This mysterious fig-ure must be Jesus. And so, they hasten to join him.

Still, this story is radically new. It is the same Jesus, but everything has changed. No longer is he lim-ited by human frailty or weariness. This time he spreads a feast just for them, not only of grilled fish but of bread, too, that draws their minds and hearts back to the Last Supper and the first Holy Eucharist.

Sometimes we have flashbacks in our life with the Lord. A line of Scripture leaps out at us, and our hearts thrill as we remember how that very word came alive to us at an earlier time. We look around the table and remember earlier gather-ings. Perhaps we are sad because a loved one has gone on to heaven. We see a friend suffering, and we remember how God has healed us or brought us through a dark valley.

It's good to remember what God has done for us in the past. But let's not limit him in assuming he will do the very same thing again, for we know he can do far more than we imagine. Instead, let's join Peter by jumping in and rushing to where Jesus is waiting for us. United with Christ, we can not only recount stories of the past but move forward into the new work God has for us today.

"Father, thank you for joining your life to mine and walking beside me. Again, I reach out my hand, asking you to guide me today. Amen."
