Ruminations

When we were celebrating mass in the school gym for 7 years before the opening of the new Worship Space in Ajax, one of the biggest complaints we heard from people was that it looked too much like a gym and so it was hard to worship. Well we formed a committee to see what we could do about that. Our first foray into transforming the gym necessitated a trip to Fabricland. We had decided to hang some banners throughout the gym to see what it would do. At the time I was a complete novice. I had absolutely no idea about materials, and textures, and strengths, and draping capabilities, and washing care, and whether or not it was easy to sew. Luckily the head of our little committee was an expert. Certainly over the 7 years our décor grew in complexity and sophistication, so much so that the growing team would meet on Friday evenings to assemble the masterpieces. They became quite elaborate with mobiles and live hanging plants. When we moved into the new digs, the little band of artisans disbanded for the most part. But instead of every week the pace slowed to seasonally. We became regular customers at Fabricland and a local store called the Lace Place. They knew us by name there and we had special cutting privileges that were not afforded to regular customers. Part of the reason was the amount of material we purchased. The largest purchase we made was almost a guarter mile of material, over twelve hundred feet of various colours and textures. The scale of space in decorating a church means that you need to be ready to have people stare at baskets, carts, or hands full of bolts of material. Even to plan some banners for here, it takes about 15 yards of material provided that it is all in one piece on the bolt. Often times we check at the store to ensure that they haven't shipped a split bolt meaning that the bolt may actually be two or three pieces rolled onto the one, which is useless for our purposes. Now last week we celebrated Remembrance Vespers. Vespers is truly one of the Church's hidden treasures and with the candle light, it is especially holy. But to help with the ambience, we added some extra candlelight. So I headed over to Michael's Craft Store. They are generally kind of pricey until they have a sale, and when they have a sale, it is worth the trip. They had coloured Mason jar candle holders on sale. I filled a cart with a variety tallying 48 of them. As I pushed the cart to the cashier, you could see her eyes bulging. She had a fright of needing to wrap them individually. I declined that telling her I would be very careful. After the shock of swiping each of them, her curiosity got the best of her and she asked about them, so I told her they were for a prayer service at St. Elizabeth Seton Parish. Alas, she had never heard of it. I invited her...



Anyway, speaking of scales, I am off to place our poinsettia order for Christmas, I6 big pots and 30 smaller parts. They know me by name at Bradford Greenhouses too. Tis the season.


Adult Faith Formation Session 1
