

Ruminations

There is no doubt that the Christmas rush is in full swing. Traffic in the mall, the stores are crowded and "Black Friday" has been extended to entice us procrastinators in. We even took full advantage of the beautifully warm Tuesday to string the Christmas lights around the outside of the Church. It sure beats trying to do it closer to Christmas with freezing temperatures and freezing fingers and freezing tushes. In fact, I think I got sunburned. I would hate to explain to the doctor that I suffered sunstroke from putting Christmas lights up. It seems almost like an oxymoron. And events are speeding up in the life of the Church. The first leg of our parents' faith formation is complete. The baptisms are finished for this calendar year with no more scheduled until mid-January. The Christmas pageant will soon be taking registrations and the New Years' community has a novel and different celebration planned that will have everyone singing "O here we come a Wassailing". By the way, wassail is a mulled apple cider for those who were wondering. Now if the cider were spiked, it would become Hogmanay. There is an air of excitement and anticipation floating around. This pales in comparison however to all those candidates and catechumens who were welcomed into their particular order in the RCIA. If you remember they were welcomed at the door and or signed with the sign of the cross over their body. We offered them the Gospel of Jesus and we prayed for them and promised to support them on their journey. They officially became Catholic members of our community though not fully initiated yet. As a cradle catholic, I marvel as the rites unfold filled with a sense of envy and terror at the same time. Part of me would love to experience the intimacy of their journey, but a saner part of me thanks my parents for baptizing me 17 days after my birth. But when one listens to the profound experiences that these people had, I think envy arises again. One can only imagine how they felt, the center of attention with the congregation of mostly strangers, welcoming them in, and attentively and prayerfully offering them a place in our midst. The incredible warmth and humility of the same people applauding their desire to become part of us. And then, the topper for most of them was the number of, now fellow parishioners, coming up and congratulating them, and shaking their hands and welcoming them after Mass. It was an overwhelming show of Christ's hospitality and they all drank it in, and it resonates with them still. The Ritual directives for the RCIA emphasize how important the congregation is in helping these journeyers find their way, in making them feel like they have come home. And whether their journey has been from another denomination, or first time Gospel encounters, no matter what their backstory was, or is, they all recognized, sometimes tearfully, that their story is our story



too. It is called the rite of welcome for a reason, and through the outreach of our parishioners, they truly got the message that they are in the right place. As the documents say, it takes a parish to make a Catholic. The journey continues.


