

## **Ruminations** ....

In February 1983, a notice was placed on the bulletin board in the Sports Administration building at university. The Calgary Olympic Committee had a few openings for various positions relating to the up-coming Olympics. Most of my classmates were much more interested in the professional side of sports, and few of them had any time for the amateur athletics (if one can refer to the present day Olympic athletes as amateur). So I talked to the dean of Sports Administration. He admitted that in all likelihood the positions would be taken up internally but that the job positions were distributed by an obligation of transparency. But he recommended submitting an application anyway as a means of getting my name out there. There was no internet or Google so the only real thing I knew about Calgary was the Rodeo and cowboy hats, and that it was close to Banff, one of those bucket list places that I wanted to go. Well, nothing came of the application. The closest I came to any official Olympic business was carrying the torch in East Gwillimbury (not even the real torch relay, but a local offshoot) down by Anchor Park. It was still a thrill, and the carrying of that torch was also the carrying of all the fantasies of my own Olympic imaginings, either schussing down the mountain slopes, or speeding around the oval, or traversing the cross country trails. myself thought it was a gold medal performance. There was an option to purchase a souvenir replica of the torch, but that just didn't interest me in the least. One of my biggest thrills was eventually making it to Calgary after the Olympics and visiting the different venues. It was a great joy to visit the speed skating oval and watching the Canadian team stride around the ice. There was an opportunity to rent some speed skates and do public skating on this venerable place so I jumped at the chance. I laced up these peculiar skates and stepped out onto the ice and fell flat on my, well you can imagine. Undaunted I pulled myself up by the boards and inched my way around the entire quarter mile track. In the meantime the Canadian team was flying past. It took me almost half an hour to make my way around, mostly because I was soaking in the atmosphere thinking that one of my Olympic heroes had been on this same ice. When I arrived where I had started, I sat down on the bench, unlaced the skates and just sat there with sore feet, but feeling very satisfied and fulfilled. There was a time when I knew every Canadian athlete by name, now not so much. Although I still have a soft spot for the Olympics, and more so the Winter Olympics, and this despite the loss of purity of sport and introduction of drugs and politics



in any judging events (anything that needs a judge should be eliminated), and scandals, I will still be glued to the television, or now computer watching with great admiration and active imagination as we celebrate the XXIII Winter Olympics.


