## **Ruminations** ....

People are often curious as to how a young sports enthusiast, whose undergraduate degree was sports administration, shifted direction to become a priest. It seems an odd transition, and let's face it, a rather large leap. In my mind, not so much, and when I really think about it, it makes perfect sense. Our vantage point now with regards to the Olympic spirit has been tainted by a culture that exalts the results more than the struggle. Success is defined in terms of podium finishes and winning at all costs. Many Olympic stories drive this point home, whether it's the proliferation of performance enhancing drugs starting way back in Montreal in 1976 with the East German women's swim team, or the 1992 scoring debacle involving Canadian Sylvie Frechette and a Brazilian judge who made a mistake on the scoring computer that the officials would not let rectify thereby reducing the gold medal performance to a silver. The real tragedy was the lady who won the gold by mistake was unapologetic saying she deserved it. Fourteen months later Sylvie was upgraded to her earned gold medal. But at its originals, there was a purity and innocence about the pursuit of "citius, altius, fortius", the motto of the games, "faster, higher stronger". If I were president of the international Olympic Games as was my teenage dream, anything that requires any human judgment regarding scoring would be gone. There is no way of eliminating the subjective and inconsistent appeal to adjudicating beauty and artistic merit. The pursuit of excellence should go to the first across the finish line, the one who throws the farthest, the one who jumps the highest. This journey towards excellence is a very religious theme. It is a journey to discovery of ourselves and our depths. It is a journey of confronting ourselves and overcoming obstacles, of striving to become better. It is an exercise in fair play, like the Canadian Olympic sailor who surrendered his medal hopes to sail off course to help a floundering competitor, or the Norwegian coach who offered a Canadian cross country skier a new ski pole when hers broke mid-course. It is the father who jumped on the track to walk with his injured son to cross the finish line after a pulled hamstring caused him to drop out of the race, though it was important to finish, redefining true Olympic success. It is about the Canadian speed skater who surrendered his spot on the team after a misfortunate stumble by a true contender teammate...the Olympics was once about ideals and true human spirit. That is not much different than our own spiritual journeys, especially as we enter into this Lenten discipline, where we too are invited to strive for our own betterment, to reach higher, and become stronger. We need an Olympic effort to achieve our own best. In that way, Pierre de Coubertin's words ring true, "The most important thing in the Olympic



Games is not winning but taking part; the essential thing in life is not conquering but fighting well."
