Ruminations

I never had allergies growing up. I could run through grassy fields, jump along bales of hay, climb pollen filled trees, and eat those things I liked (though I must confess that those things I dislike were easy to get out of by claiming allergies to them, like fish, certain repugnant vegetables like eggplant and zucchini, mushrooms... it's a very long list). As I have, let's say, ripened through the years, things have started to affect me, and often times there are fits of sneezing, itchy and watery eyes, and running noses. Most of it was conquered with Reactine. One of the culprits I discovered was the 25 year old carpeting in the rectory. Over the last seven years, we have been attempting to eliminate the sources. A couple of years back, the carpet in the living room was replaced with laminate and things got a bit better on the nose front, but there was still a dining room full of the old pink (now darkened with much use) carpet. The problem was that there was a great unevenness to the floor. It dropped by over 2 inches with a ridge spanning into the kitchen. The floor sloped away from the wall and it was impossible to replace the carpet with laminate. The only cosmetic option was to replace it with more carpet, but that would not solve the issue of the sloping floor. So a civil engineering company came and took a look. Other than major, major work, it could not be completely resolved. Luckily some very able and skilled and humorous people took on the task of rectifying the rectory. For the most part, the floor has been made level, at least level enough to install laminate, though the kitchen slope is still an issue and is in progress. Now the real dilemma rears its ugly head. The walls need to be repainted and the laminate colour needs to be selected. There have been at least two dozen paint chips taped to the wall trying to find just the right colour. Of course there are about the same number of opinions as to the direction it should go. Greys, tans, off whites, neutrals are all on the palette. The wall now is a pale pink, or neutral pink, a colour that looks like it was thinned too much. The original painter needed to repaint as he was a thinner (couldn't resist). To me it just says blah! Now with the first set of options I collected, apparently some are too yellow, or too peachy, or too dark or too light. I'm not really a neutral fan. I like a punch of colour. I like it when a wall makes a statement, but I am in a minority of one with that opinion. I would also wait until I find the perfect colour, but with the myriad of options that may never happen. The saving grace is that I



have company coming for dinner in mid-March so sooner rather than later I will need to make a choice- a choice that will likely remain the dominant colour for the next 30 years. So beware the ides of March.


