



Ruminations

It has been said that a Canadian is one who incessantly talks about the weather. In fact, it has become the stereotypical introduction into conversations. When all else fails, mentioning something about the weather situation is a great ice breaker. This past week I was helping a young student memorize the Canadian provinces and their capitals, and when it came to Manitoba, the little trick to remember its capital was the truly Canadian joke of calling it 'Winterpeg'. Let's just say he aced the test. Apparently we talk more about the weather than any other nation on earth. It's not like we are the only country with very diverse weather patterns, and seasonal fluctuations. In the news this morning there was an item about the North Pole reaching above the zero mark in temperature in the middle of winter, over twenty degrees above where it should be. That despite those who claim that there is no such thing as global warming. It seems every year we are gifted with this reprieve from the harshness of the blowing snow and plummeting temperatures of the deep freeze. But there are real costs to these fluctuations. There is the great heaving of the pavement in our parking lot that will only be resolved with the authentic spring thaw. There are the flooded basements and roadways, and the tragic loss of life in floodwaters. Apparently this year the number of salt days has depleted the provincial supply and our parking lot like many others will either see an increase in the cost of salting or a decrease in the amount of salt (which I think our gardens will love). I think there is a kind of psychological cost too. This little teasing of the arrival of spring gets our hopes up and our bodies ready for the turn of the season. I wore shorts on that warm Tuesday to walk over to the gym. But we always receive this warm spell with a tinge of scepticism. As much as we rejoice in the glorious sunshine and relative warmth, there is always the feeling in the back of the mind that it will all coming crashing down, or that we will pay for it later. Of course we are still in for more cold temperatures. Of course there is going to be more snow accumulations. And despite what Wiarton Willie predicted, spring officially arrives on Tuesday, March 20 at 9:16 in the morning. That doesn't mean warm weather, sunshine, and crocuses. The only true thing that we can predict is the unpredictability of the weather. And maybe that's why it is always such a topic of conversation. Kind of



sounds like Lent, a season dedicated to reflecting on the unpredictability of our lives, and finding truth in our experiences. So maybe pull up a lawn chair, dust off the snow, sit in the sun and have a good reflection on the meaning of life, and the gift of unseasonable weather, eh?!

11 @ 11:00 and March 18@ 9:30.




