Ruminations

My last March Break was last century, in fact, it took place in 1979, and it was a nostalgic time because I recognized it as the last one. Now March breaks were really hit and miss. It could be spring-like, with warm sunny days that allowed the neighbourhood students to get out and romp around with a fresh goofiness and energy after the winter hibernation. For most of my life our street was a dirt road, and the warming of the dirt meant that we could play marbles by grinding our heels into the dirt to create a little hole where the alleys could be tossed into and the winner collecting the pot. The spring break could also be ferociously winter which in a sense was preferable because it meant we could play hockey on the pond, and gather around the little log fire to don and doff our skates, and it was never so bitterly cold as January or February could be, so mornings and afternoon marathons were possible. It also meant that we could be zooming down the hill on toboggans, or snow sliders, or magic carpets cocooned within the ever popular snowmobile suits which were all the rage. The March break could also be one of those transition weather patterns where each day could be greeted with a barrage of snow, sleet, wind, and rain. This was the time before two car families and a bus service into Newmarket and beyond. There were no March break programs, and the newly opened library in Holland Landing was a small store front affair with nothing but books. There was no extracurricular activities to be had and so one was literally stuck in the Landing, and the only reprieve from boredom was our own imagination. Even television was not much of an escape. For most of my spring breaks were pre-cable television so we could watch Barrie T.V. or Toronto's CBLT or CFTO, and let's face it, "The Trouble with Tracy" had little to offer adults, let alone young people. There were no computers, or x-boxes or play stations. Back then, electronics were not for toys, so sometimes four boys could get into a lot of trouble and much of the indoor activities rendered mom a referee more than anything else. So that last official spring break though was different. First there was ample homework to keep me occupied. There was a major chemistry essay to finish and the topic was either chemical luminescence, or the chemistry of the blood (one was the grade 12 essay and the other the grade 13 project.) I did well on both and my chemistry teacher wrote a note indicating that the blood chemistry one was worthy of medical school. He had no idea of my huge aversion to anything blood, flesh or bone related. I have a



hard time eating meat with the bones still in and the thought of bodily fluids- well, let's just say it would never happen. So I look at our young people with all their options and possibilities with a bit of jealousy, so long as they get to endure a bit of boredom that needs creativity's release. Happy March Break.


