#### Ruminations ....

On the longest day of this year, June 21, we will enjoy 15 hours, twenty-six minutes and 31 seconds of daylight, weather permitting. That is substantially more than the shortest day of the year, December 21 where we will experience a mere 8 hours, fifty-five minutes and 46 seconds, again, weather permitting. It really is fascinating to think that Florida only gets a maximum of 13 hours, fifty-seven minutes and 41 seconds and a minimum of 10 hours, 19 minutes and 38 seconds. We have a big shift, season to season and if the truth be known, I don't think I could live in a country that has the same old pattern of daylight month after month. There is something life giving and healthy about the ebbs and flows of the rhythm of the seasons, at least in my mind. I suppose the shift into a 'daylight savings time' was a means of capturing the most of the summer burst of sunshine even though half of the growth really comes in the spring and in fact, when summer finally arrives the days begin to shorten. There is nothing better than being able to sit outside early in the summer mornings before life and industry quicken, feeling the warmth of the sun as it rises, hearing the chirping birds busying themselves with their morning songs, or sitting outside as the sun is setting as an extended twilight bestows a peace and tranquility and quiet on the backyard. So I understand the efforts to prolong the opportunities for daylight. On the other hand, studies tell us that the single most tragic day or accidents is the day after the time switch. It can wreak havoc on our bodily systems, and the poor farmers – the dairy cows don't seem to adjust at all. The autumn change is wonderful. In a society chronically deprived of sleep, that extra hour is a welcome gift, though if you are like me, I usually blow the opportunity by staying up just a bit later. And of course, it is always amusing watching people who forget to change their clocks arriving early for the Sunday morning mass. There is always someone who arrives an hour early. Who knows, maybe Saskatchewan has it right. They do not inflict the twice a year burden on their people, and although their two big activities, farming and curling are really unaffected by the change in time, it still seems like a pretty civilized and intelligent thing to do. As the years pass, it seems to take more and more of a toll on me. The





earlier morning is kind of a cruel hoax, and certainly Mass attendance on that weekend indicates that it takes a toll on a lot of other people too. Until we decide to forgo this unnecessary celestial trick there is only one real solution, and I availed myself of the only tried and true, God-given remedy, a wonderful afternoon nap.


