

Ruminations

I guess it's no secret that I am a great fan of the "Walking Dead" television series. I rarely miss it and on the few occasions that I have, I learned how to view it after the fact, not by 'PVR-ing' it which is way beyond my skill set, but someone told me that it can be viewed on a Demand channel, 100 on my television. I feel so hip and modern every time I can watch it on my time. It is about so much more than Zombies, though they do add a bit of suspense and action. It is an exploration of the breakdown of human civilization that challenges what we have come to define as good and evil. It amuses and intrigues me. After the Easter Triduum onslaught, I have to admit that I kind of feel a bit like the walking dead. On the day after the crowds had dissipated and the Triduum was over, I just sat on the couch in a semi-catatonic state reflecting on the events of the last several days. What was more exhausting was remembering the vast number of hours that people had given in support of their fellow parishioners who would be celebrating with us. These celebrations make look flawless, except for a priest who forgot to process the oils in on Holy Thursday, or a priest who forgot to call the newly baptised up around the altar at the Vigil, or the priest who forgot to put out the book lights or the choir or the ambo, or the priest who forgot to.... I think of the choirs who start months before honing their notes, or the hospitality ministers who needed to be schedules and informed of procedures and logistics, or the lector scheduling which takes on many drafts and calls to sort out the various readings, or the Eucharistic ministers who have to sort out a whole slew of events to ensure adequate coverage for the increased attendance, or the money counters who do double time to ensure that the collections are counted and banked and not hanging around the premises so as not to lead nefarious people into temptation, or the environment team who meet for hours trying to figure out designs and flowers for the inside and outside, and not just designs, but spectacular designs to welcome Easter, and the hours spent transforming the space for Thursday, then Friday, then Saturday and beyond (and whose job of keeping the flowers alive for 50 days) or the months of work with those people who were initiated to help them discern the presence of God in their lives, not to mention the 40 towels that needed to be washed, and the forty gowns needing to be washed and pressed and stored for next year. It was exhausting just writing about it all. So just take a moment in gratitude for those people who do step up to ensure that the



celebrations of the holiest time of our year were worthy of the magnitude of Easter. And it was GLORIOUS. Alleluia, alleluia. I trust there will be resurrection for this Walking Dead.
