#### **Ruminations** ....

I'm not really sure of the distinction between suburban and rural. I always referred to Holland Landing as a rural community. Although we didn't live on a farm, there was almost no where one could drive without passing barns, silos, cows or horses, or fields of corn and wheat. In fact one of my favorite barns is the blue barn on the north-west corner of Davis Drive and Bathurst Street. One of our "car-games" used to be name the crop in the field, onions, cauliflower, carrots, lettuce or celery. And I suppose the experience of baling hay was kind of a rite of passage. Sheep and goats were much rarer to see driving by and pigs were almost invisible. We never really saw them unless we were visiting my uncle's farm. The pigs were always in pens and never left roaming free. We could chase the chickens and pet the horse, but we could never go too near the pigs. There were always big warnings and reminders about that before we were set loose to explore the barn and the orchard and the pond. Every year there was a pair of geese who would nest on the little island in the pond, in the crook of the willow tree that grew there. And if you were there at the right time, you would see the little goslings waddling up the shore to feed on the grasses. If we visited in a succession of weeks, the number of goslings would be diminished. My aunts explained that there were snapping turtles in the pond that liked the delicacy of young geese. It was always a thrill to see the Canada geese return each year. Back then there didn't seem to be an epidemic of them. This week as my nephew was practicing with his coach in the football field at Cardinal Carter High School, I was helping fetch the discuses from the field. So there is always a reminder to keep one's head up because as these objects are flung at great distances, they can take very precarious trajectories. There have been several times when I have had to dodge out of the way of flying objects. I swear that my nephew had purposely tried to make me run with a near miss on 'hit the running uncle game'. Now I have been involved in track for a long time, and being in the field marking javelin or discus throws has an exciting element of danger built into it – to be close enough to mark it, but not so close as to be impaled. As I keep reminding my nephew, "I'm not afraid of you." But the biggest worry out in the field is not flying implements, but rather, stepping in goose droppings. The other day there was at least a dozen geese



occupying the far end of the pitch, but the whole field, and the track itself were covered with goose reminders, and in the grass, it was like a minefield of slippery surprises. I don't remember so many geese in so many places. There is no pond, or lake or water in the middle of a school sports field, but apparently the Canada geese are taking up residence wherever they like. Where are the snapping turtles when you need them. Fr. Roy


