# Ruminations ....

To start or not to start that is the question. Now all sorts of commentary and articles have been written about the war of the sexes, especially as it pertains to the office or home thermostat. Just of peace of mind, I refuse to engage or acknowledge or enter into any dialogue that mentions how cold or hot the office is. The resolution was to surrender control of the thermostat in the office but maintain control of the one in the rectory. The two thermostats in the church are up for grabs but one consideration in the church is that a cool 8 am mass ends up being a hot 11 am. That either is caused by the hot air of the homilist especially when the deacons are preaching, or the collective warmth of the community gathered. I remember friends from Cape Breton celebrating the occasion of when the furnace was started up in the Fall or shut down in the Spring. However it was a great place to come in from the cold of outside and rest frozen feet on, dry out socks and mitts, and even to sit cross-legged wrapped in a blanket to thaw away the winter activities, that was until the butt got too hot. We didn't have a fireplace in our house and I kind of think our little misplaced furnace vent served the same function. It was a place of warmth and gathering and no matter how many times we



tripped over it, we still very much appreciated it after the all day sessions skating on the pond. All that being said, I have no desire to sit cross legged on some vent to keep warm. I have neither the occasion nor the ability to do so. I may get down, but getting up again would not be pretty or easy. So as we enter into the new season, holding off from turning the furnace on, out of defiance and economy, we are certainly fortunate to have the option to start or not to start. Keep warm. *Fr.
