## **Ruminations** ....

I'm not really sure what constitutes an ordinary day in parish life. Certainly Mondays provide a lively irregularity that serves to keep life exciting. That was so true of this past Monday. It began with a call from my brother just as I was stepping out of the shower at 7:30 in the morning. This was somewhat unusual because he usually calls me on his car phone when he is driving somewhere and bored with the drive. So he informed that that he had just received a call from the Home where my mother resides. They were taking her by ambulance to the emergency unit at Southlake. Something happened during the night and they figured my mother dislocated her shoulder but it was beyond their ability to cope. So as soon as morning mass was over, I rushed to emerge and found my brother sitting with mom who for all that apparently happened was in good spirits and relaxed. The doctor had already ordered a CT scan and X-ray series. Then began the marathon. For the most part, we were left pretty much alone in cubicle 9. It was an interesting place to sit and wait as it was a high traffic area and it was like our own little television screen with doctors and nurses, beds and wheelchairs passing by in front of us. There were sound affects with beeps and hums and pages being announced intermittently. All the while we waited. At very infrequent intervals, a nurse would pop her head in, or check mom's blood pressure. Because she had been sent from the home before medication rounds her blood pressure which relies on pills to be normalized kept climbing. Even the machine itself was giving warning but no one seemed too concerned. Finally we were taken for a CT-scan to check out the obvious symptoms of a fall and head strike. All was clear. Then hurry up and wait again. When we arrived back to her room, there was a man there with a walker and sneered that this was not his wife - he was in the wrong place and apparently lost his wife. The next trip was to X-ray following which she had to give up her room and be relegated to the hall near where the ambulance patients arrived, and it was a steady arriving of young and old. At long last this teenage looking doctor arrived at her bedside to inform us that mom's head scan was clear but the x-ray showed she had broken her collar bone. We had a brief discussion and I wanted to ask him if he wanted me to sign his community service hours paper for high school. We were ready to take mom back to Bradford. She was put in a sling, given hospital robes and pants and socks and slippers because she left the home without anything but her pajamas, but then we had to get her to stand up. Her cognitive



abilities meant she couldn't figure out to stand up on command or sit down on command. It took three of us directing and guiding body parts to get her into a chair and then into the The nurses and technicians and car. volunteers were absolutely wonderful, patient and respectful of a hard situation. Through it all, mom was in great spirits and as cooperative as a cognitively challenged person could be. Ah sweet oblivion.
