Ruminations

I'm not sure when Hallowe'en turned a corner but I remember the excitement for Hallowe'en when Zellers brought in their selection of masks. They simply covered your face and the elastic band which was secured only by a staple was a source of panic because the elastic never held and needed to be re-threaded through the staple. There were no accessories and the Hallowe'en masks were an exotic novelty. Most costumes where home-made bed sheets for ghosts and made up faces to look like ghouls and monsters, and there were many Draculas roaming the streets. The candy bag was usually a pillowcase which meant the bags needed to be empty upon arriving home or sleeping without a pillow case. A successful night was determined by the level in the pillow case or the number of times you had to return home to empty the haul because it was becoming too burdensome to carry. Most of the candy consisted of molasses kisses which I loved. They are hard to find and I now have a great fear of them pulling out my fillings from cavities likely caused because of Hallowe'en. There were bags of chips and the odd chocolate bar from neighbours who reserved 'the good stuff' for the local kids. One of the favorite stops was the candy apples that were home-made with real caramels that all needed to be removed from their individual packaging. There were no Hallowe'en lights or inflatable ghosts. The extent of the decorating was the candle-lit pumpkin, and when the candle went out or was snuffed out, it indicated that there was no use going to the door because they were out of stash. (it also meant they were fair game for a good soaping to teach them a lesson - though I myself never once participated in such retribution, my parents would have made me eat the soap for such a prank, and back in our in neighbourhood, everybody knew who you were, no matter how to tried to disguise yourself.) In a town with rather sketchy street lights that were more often not working than working, the streets had a very eerie aura, especially the years that were misty or foggy, perfect for a ghoulish night. In such a setting, the flickering glow of pumpkins in the windows only added to the mystique. My dad was rather creative and he took great pride in carving a frightfully scary jack-o-lantern. It was the source of many a comment and compliment and people would walk by just to see each year's rendition. With Hallowe'en being elevated to a much more commercial exercise, with front yard cemeteries and light shows, dad's creation would seem rather mundane and amateurish. The best thing about Hallowe'en was that it meant we had the following day off school, a Catholic School thing. I sometimes wonder if it was merely a holy day thing or a matter of self defense for teachers knowing the uncontrollability of students hyped up on sugar. I don't remember the year I stopped trick or treating, but I think I like it more now than back



then. It is a wonderfully fun way to celebrate our faith and usher in a pre-Christmas season of recognizing the arrival of the kingdom of God in our midst- a place where the 'Saints go marching in!'




