

#### **Ruminations** ....

I suppose Remembrance Day is designed to be subdued, a time of quiet and reflection. This being the hundredth anniversary I liked the idea of ringing the bells across the country. There is not much more hauntingly beautiful and solemn than a slow tolling of the bells. We are fortunate that the bell from the mission church of Our Lady of Good Counsel remains part of our parish treasures, and there are conversations around how best to bring that bell into the public forum. And speaking of bells, we are in for a wonderful Christmas gift courtesy of the CGW. This year's Remembrance Day weekend was particularly emotional for our family, at least for me, and more so than any other. I remember having a holiday from school in honour of the Day though it wasn't as exciting as one might think; the weather was usually too cold and rainy to play outside, and that being the case, television programming on the two channels that we got were unappealing to young eyes. So four boys pent up in the house on dreary November days must have presented themselves as equally horrifying to mom as the black and white documentaries that were broadcast on the television. I'm sure she had to intervene on many war fronts throughout the course of the day. A raised voice signalled the imposed truce on hockey sticks in battle. This year the silence seemed particularly sombre and the bell pulled a little deeper. Charles Dickens' opening "It was the best of times. It was the worst of times" seemed incredibly poignant. After a lot of thought and consideration, my nephew has decided to enroll in the Canadian Forces, a dream he has had since grade 5. As a seminarian I had participated in a military project to do basic training and receive my commission. At the time, life in the military was a less dangerous proposition and that was before the Iron Curtain came down. Since then, the world has become crazier and more dangerous. There were many steps along the way and at each one I was hoping that this train would be derailed. As an athlete my nephew suffered several concussions through hockey, football and rugby. It is only recently that he has overcome some of the effects. In my mind this was a perfect out, a medical rejection of his application. Alas, he was cleared. The day he received his acceptance he gave me a call to inform me. There was this gasped silence as the reality sunk in. He was so excited but I was filled with mixed emotions. I was happy for him that his long dream was coming true and he was finding



direction. I was sad for the rest of us at the possibilities that lie ahead. He will be leaving for basic training shortly after Christmas. Despite the sense of urgency heading to Christmas that our retail culture is inflicting on us, I am in no hurry for Christmas to arrive now. So now Remembrance Day for us isn't so much about the past but the future, that our little soldier boy stays safe physically and mentally. Perhaps I can console myself and whenever he comes back, I can don my old uniform and make him salute me, because I outrank him. *Fr. Roy*
