# **Ruminations** ....

This week marks the anniversary of the dedication of the building of St. Elizabeth Seton. In the life of the Church, it is a very prominent and rich liturgy that unfortunately most people never get to experience. It is filled with symbolism and pomp, ritual and meaning. The whole point of the liturgy is to remind the people of God who they are. I have experienced several such celebrations and I was the pastor for one of them. In an ideal world, the celebration of the dedication should be the very first liturgy celebrated in the new space. The congregation is led into the building from the outside by the bishop who presides. In the process of organizing the event we made it quite clear that the first Mass would be the dedication. Of course we received flak from the diocesan contingent. Their plan was to let us settle in to the new place for a couple of months and then arrange it. So there is a saying that the difference between a liturgist and a terrorist is that you can negotiate with a terrorist. Fresh off my master's degree in liturgy from Notre Dame University (whose football team is ranked third and will likely finish the season without a loss) I insisted that the first celebration be the dedication. They conceded and so on a hot summer afternoon, Cardinal Ambrozic in very frail health presided at the opening. I didn't invite a lot of priests to the event. I only invited those priests who had some hand in journeying with us to make the new worship space a reality. So over 1,500 parishioners and one other priest joined to celebrate. It was in his frailty the bishop designated me to perform some of the walking around rituals that are usually the Bishop's privilege to do. I got to anoint the Church with holy water, and that building was soaked, after all any sprinkling rite is a time to have some fun. Then I got to anoint the walls with sacred chrism. Finally I had the honour of lighting the Church for the first time. It was a grand afternoon and a fun time was had by all, or at least by me as I got to play bishop for a bit. Now on the walls where the chrism was traced into the sign of the cross, a memorial cross and candle are supposed to be erected and the candle lit every year on the anniversary. The oil has long since dried



after 27 years here. So hopefully we remember to light them this year. It is fascinating liturgy because a throughout the prayers and actions, the main purpose is not so much to bless the building but rather to remind the people that it is they who are holy; it is they who are sacred; it is they who are the Church. 
