Ruminations

Advent was an interesting time in our home. We were natural tree people and usually set out the week before Christmas to find a tree. My dad always reasoned that if the tree was put up too early, all the needles would fall off before we ended the Christmas celebrations at Epiphany. I don't remember the Baptism of Jesus ever being recognized as a Christmas event. The tree came down at Epiphany, or at least what was left of it. It was hauled way to the back of the yard to return to the earth on its own time and in doing so served as a wonderful refuge for the rabbits seeking protection. Every time we went down to the pond to play hockey, we passed the tree and tried to identify all the animal tracks that surrounded it. The big event was bringing out the advent wreath and the candle holders. Of course I was the big enthusiast about getting things out. Back then most of Christmas supplies came from either Zellers or Woolworths. Looking back I would suggest that one would describe our house and our tree as late sixties Zellers décor. When Sears finally arrived with the opening of Upper Canada Mass, a whole new direction in decorations emerged. My most memorable purchase was two pairs of sweet whimsical angel candleholders that we placed around the wreath and lit each Sunday night at our family dinner. Our candles were not the standard purple and pink but rather red. Why red one might ask. Well, in truth the purple candles just looked awful in the candle holders and the red seemed to glow beautifully - form over function. When advent was complete, the candle holders than served as Christmas dinner centre pieces. They were a long serving piece of our Advent/Christmas display. In fact, it was such a thrill when my mom, who had to take over the task of decorating the house included them in her little Christmas village that adorned our buffet. That buffet had been a wedding gift to my grandparents when they got married back in the 1920's. The little Norman Rockwell village display complete with lit houses, a couple of shops and of course a Church along with carolers, street lights and little Christmas trees bookended by the four angels, was the fascination and wonder of the next generation, my nephews and nieces. When they were



little, only able to watch the twinkling of the village lights by standing on tip toe, their eyes wide with awe, they would huddle around it asking grandma to turn the lights on and make the carolers sing. Since we had to sell the house, I have lost track of where the angels have gone. I know the Christmas Village is in Mississauga. Mom eventually conceded to a fake tree and that is here in the rectory. But as for the angels that would now be over 40 years old, your guess is as good as mine. Happy Advent. Fr. Roy
