Ruminations

For much of those formative years of school, the beginning of Advent indeed signaled a time of intense preparation, not so much for the coming of the kingdom of God at the end of time, and not so much for even the coming of Christmas. The start of Advent marked the onset of exam season. Back then, schools worked on a three semester system so all the metrics to fill out a report card needed to be completed before Christmas, Easter and the end of June. Elementary school exams were not nearly so onerous as the high school and university versions. Advent had turned into a season cramming and studying. The first set of exams in grade nine were daunting. We had eight classes a day, and most of those classes required exams during exam week. There were only three venues where the exams took place, the boys' gym, the girls' gym, and the auditorium. Over the weekend the custodians hauled most of the desks and chairs from the classrooms and dutifully lined them up in long rows transforming the venues into a measured and orderly hall of interrogation. Back in the days before computers, it must have been a monumental task of scheduling all the various exams and grade levels, including grade thirteens into three daily time slots, accounting for the number of students sitting down to write at any one time. For us, the dreaded fear was three exams in one day. On occasion there were conflicts and special accommodation needed to be arranged. One year my German exam was at the same time as my chemistry exam so I was sequestered in the library to write both exams. University was much the same with exams. The toughest year was third year when the exams were scheduled over five consecutive days all early in the morning, and the final exam on the final day was a five hour affair. As you were sitting at your desk scribbling and calculating away and watching the people who had an hour exam and two hour exam and then three hour exam all depart to start their Christmas vacation, it was a bit exasperating. Finally the only ones who remained were the sports administration and commerce students, all in a row or two in the vastness of a now almost empty gymnasium. The temptation to start thinking about home and Christmas was strong and you had to fight to keep focus on the task at hand. It was such a sense of relief to sign the exam papers and hand it in. Over the last half hour as people starting finishing up and leaving, shouts of joy and tension resounded in the hall as those finishing students signaled their exuberance. The end of the exams was the beginning of any thoughts of Christmas. The concerns then turned to how to get home, packing, arranging to get to the bus depot and catching the bus home. In that sense the



student's life as very Advent-like, waiting, patient and anticipating, three key characteristic of this season. At least for most of us, the prospect of exams is long behind us and our iourney through Advent is more sedate and measured. Happy Advent.
