Ruminations

My first real memory of a nativity scene was at Our Lady of Grace Church in Aurora. With parents who grew up in Oak Ridges and two sets of grandparents who both contributed to the building of the original church, it was my earliest experience of church. Even though we lived in Holland Landing, the routine was to go to church at Our Lady of Grace and continue down to my grandparents' house on Elm Grove to meet up with cousins and have Sunday dinner. There were lots of trips down Yonge Street passing the old Church and every time we did, we had to trace a cross on our forehead with our thumbs. This was a routine whenever we passed any Catholic Church, along with holding our breath when driving past a cemetery, the Aurora Cemetery was a big one requiring an especially deep breath. In the foggy annals of childhood memories, the only real memory of the nativity scene in the church was that it was hidden inside one of the confessionals. As I remember, it was all done up in deep dark velvet with little mini-lights standing in for stars. I remember my dad having to pick me up to see over the barrier and it seemed like a magical place with these beautifully covered figurines of the holy family and the shepherds and their sheep, and I especially loved the magi with their magnificent camels. There was a main angel suspended over the scene with smaller, obviously less important angels hanging there too, I suppose the heavenly choirs. There was a yellow spot light on the crèche and the whole setting was serene filled with peace. It seemed that heaven itself had entered that little room, and one couldn't help but be silenced by the mystery of it all. I'm sure there must have been chips of paint missing, or discolorations, or likely a sheep or two missing a leg or an ear, but I didn't notice any of that. Years later I was shocked to learn that this perfect little picture was not always part of the festivities of Christmas and only became popular with the political statement of St. Francis of Assisi in the 13th century in support of the poor. Since the nativity scene started in Italy, most depictions stem from an Italian Renaissance modeling and interpretation. The reality is more likely a cave than a stable, but that is neither here nor there. The nativity set still excites me and what has made it grow was to understand that it



recognizes that Christ is still being born today, in each and every culture, that it is not exclusive to the Italian medieval art world. That is precisely why I love our display. This year we are over 80 countries from almost every continent, and if the mail strike hasn't delayed our newest ones, Tonga and Belarus should be represented as well. Enjoy our nativities.
