

#### **Ruminations** ....

On the eve of Christmas Eve I had a couple of last minute errands to run and two episodes were a bit disconcerting. The first one was at Lowe's. I went in looking for Christmas details and the Christmas section was in the process of being replaced by spring and summer items like barbeques and the like. We technically hadn't even started Christmas and already we were moving on to summer, which if the truth be known, was somewhat hope inspiring, even for a professed winter person. The next one minutes later was a Pier I where I picked up a couple of blue lanterns for the nativity barrier. The clerk remarked that she thought they were the best colour, but a said they weren't as Christmasy as the red and green one. She then commented that the day after Christmas it won't matter because Christmas will be over. That prompted a dialogue, no rather a monologue of the history of the Christmas season. At least she had heard of the Twelve Days of Christmas though apparently she had no idea what it meant. I don't think she gave me the pre-boxing day discount. The days following Christmas day are really vegging days if at all possible. So on Friday I did nothing but battle a fever and sniffles and a foggy brain. There was absolutely nothing on television so I listened to the radio. Of course there wasn't a Christmas song to be heard, even though Christmas day was filled with wonderful sounds of classical Christmas fare perfect for laying on the couch, wrapped in a warm quilt and just relaxing in various states of consciousness. They were having a call in feature as what was the best thing to do with spent Christmas trees. My favorite call was the lady who explained that Boxing Day is the day she takes her tree down and puts it back in the box to be stored until post Halloween next year. I guess it beats being stuck in the crush of the mall shopping. There is a bit of a challenge in counting the twelve days, some thinking it extends to January 5 and others to January 6, the feast of the Epiphany. In our tradition it is a moot point because the Latin Rite extends Christmas beyond the typical date of Epiphany with the arrival of the Magi (and note, nowhere does it say there were only three wise men. My mother contends that the number is highly exaggerated anyway). The Christmas season ends with the celebration of the baptism of Jesus which is the second Epiphany, this year January 13. By that time our lives have returned to the frantic pace of life, forgetting to water the Poinsettias, picking up the last of the evergreen needles and stashing decorations



back in the basement. The stores are already gearing up for Valentine's Day with hardly a moment to catch one's breath. Well if we are looking ahead from a more liturgical focus, it is only 59 days until Ash Wednesday and 105 days until Easter.
