

Christmas season is just now coming to a close. In the church anyway, it is time to take down the trees and pack up the nativity scenes for another year. The poinsettias that have survived the onslaught of Christmas will soon drop their remaining bracts and leaves and the church will be left barren in the pre-lent ordinary time which this year is rather extensive. We will keep the outside lights on until the feast of the Presentation, forty days after Christmas just as a little hint that the Church deals with time a little bit differently, and besides, it's too darn cold to take them down or to climb up on the roof to disconnect them unless absolutely necessary - and it's not. Climbing on the roof in the midst of a cold snap or snow storm goes above and beyond and if one happens to be up there when the electronic bells chime, they are likely to deafen you or bump you off the roof itself. I haven't visited my mother since before Christmas. Her floor has been on a quarantine lock down because of an outbreak of the flu which for whatever reason, mom did not contract. Of course he is nervous but the rest of us are petrified. The popular expression is that it will make a man out of him. I hope that is what it does and keeps him hale and hearty, safe and sane and in one piece. If nothing else, he will have a lot shorter hair. I know that this has been something he has wanted since grade five, but even so...... Anyway, mom wouldn't know who he is or understand the significance of the visit but I know my nephew does. This may be the last time he sees her and it is not exactly the last impression that he wants to carry with him - there are a lot fonder memories to remember her by. I think that will be a long car ride to Montreal and an even longer one coming back for my brother and sister-in-As I stare out the window, hearing the wind howl and watching the driving snowflakes, it is hard to believe it is a new year. It looks much the same as a few days ago in the old year. Little has changed physically except maybe the five extra pounds or more, but at the same time everything has changed. No one knows



what may lay ahead, but we hope – all we can really do is hope - for a safe military career, a safe last stages of life, a safe journey into the unknown, after all, it is out of our hands and entirely in the hands of God.
