Ruminations

The whole idea of de-cluttering is becoming quite the rage. Of course I am sure that this current band of de-cluttering gurus never had to deal with Christmas nativity displays. Now that we are up to 81 nativities that are displayed and a couple that are not. it seems the kindergarten-like activity of matching the shapes and forms into the storage containers from which they emerged is a much harder task than it seems. To try to save space, which is very limited and at a premium, certain sets are wrapped and doubled into containers. Then some of these containers are placed in larger containers. Over the number of years that this exercise has taken place they have been arranged and re-arranged to the point where the identifying names on the outside of the plastic bin in no way reflect the contents. For instance, the bin that indicates that Norway is inside in actual fact contains Sweden, Pakistan, Uganda and the Dominican Republic. So now the name Norway is crossed out in black marker and the other countries added, and their old bins are now scarred with names crossed off and new ones written in black marker. Heaven help the person that needs to find a specific nativity scene. They are all stacked behind the altar above the cupboards there. Some are stacked seven containers high and one of the fears is that they are very near the organ speakers and if a particularly loud note is sounded, the resulting vibrations may send them tumbling to the ground. The only one that for sure is in its properly named container is Malawi, that beautiful large sculpted rendition of the nativity in African glory. It needs to be treated with wood oil twice a year to keep the wood from cracking. That means sometime in July it will be hauled down, unwrapped and coated with a dose of tung oil to preserve it. That is just the nativities. Then there is the supporting structure which is all numbered. The skeletal poles for the backdrop and lights all need to be carefully disassembled and marked for ease of re-assembling next December and the screws all taped to the poles so they don't go wandering. The shelving structure is like an engineering feat unto itself. The foundation is actually the felt pads that go under the cinder blocks to keep the floor from being scratched. Shelves and chimney tiles, spacers and more chimney tiles all precariously balanced and cantilevered to create the look. This year's addition was the under-counter lighting and we hope will be expanded to next year. As you may have noticed there doesn't seem to be any room at the inn for any new nativities- that too is in planning stages. As we have finished the miraculous incarnation, a secondary miracle is that we are able to pack and store and find



space for all the displays. So Jesus is neatly tucked into the bins awaiting next December when we will go through the exercise again. My New Year's advice, buy stock in companies that make storage bins. Now to un-decorate the rectory. OMG! **7**r. **Roy**
