

Ruminations

It is always a little disconcerting to receive a call while driving that my mother's residence would like me to call them as soon as possible. Once again they were transporting her by ambulance to the hospital. I'm sure that the sirens were not blaring as they were worried about a possible urinary tract infection, though her blood pressure reading was over 220. So I arranged to meet her at emerge. She was laving on a stretcher accompanied by the two ambulance attendants waiting to finally be admitted to a very crowded and hectic ER. After ages she was rolled into an acute examining room. Now sitting with and conversing with someone with dementia for hours on end is quite an adventure and at times very entertaining. My mom by disposition is a joker and has a pleasant personality. It is definitely where I get my charm. My brothers take after my grandmother who was quite the opposite. As the doctors and nurses popped in and out asking mom questions and making requests like lift your arm and such, it was good to be there to inform them that she can't answer your questions or follow your instructions. So if nothing else my presence, and my brothers presence during their shift, was more to ensure that mom had a friendly face that she may or may not totally recognize, to help ease a bit of the fear and confusion she was experiencing. The doctor finally offered a game plan of antibiotics though he first asked that, since she has a DNR order whether or not we wanted her treated or to let nature take its course. Wow, what a scary question, the full impact is still haunting me. Of course we said she still has a lot of life, such as it is, and of course we want to treat her. Later when she asked who I was, for a second time, I had second thoughts. Never make decisions rooted in revenge. Feeding time was another adventure. The food was delivered and sat on the trolley for ages. Finally I just went over and retrieved the tray with mom's name on it. By this time it was barely warm which as I look back was a good thing. It mattered not to mom and if it had been hot, she risked burning her mouth. So feeding her was an experience. As I watched my brother do it he asked if she wanted more and she said no, so he stopped. I had to remind him that she didn't know what he had asked and told him to offer her more on a spoon which she devoured- I'd say quickly but she was anything but quick. She chewed and chewed and chewed each piece. Dinner was at least a 45 minute endeavour and she certainly didn't finish it, so why let it go to waste. I helped her with some of the fruit. It was the most tasteless fruit salad I had ever tasted. I let the rest go to waste, except the arrowroot cookies. She was moved from acute emergency to the Yellow Zone, those waiting to be admitted upstairs as soon as a bed becomes available. The doctor informed us that there were 280 beds and 500 plus patients which when



you think about it is an apt word for those that are sick because if there was one thing that was absolutely needed it was patience. The yellow zone is a fascinating place with an unbelievable cast of characters ripe for a television series. As they say fact is stranger than fiction. God bless the teams that work in such conditions.
