Ruminations

There was a time when mom decided to try her hand at ceramics. On Tuesday nights she would arrive home with a box with a pre-cast ceramic project that she was to sand down and clean up. Then it was taken back to the studio where it was either painted or glazed. There were serving plates and statues. One of mom's favorite pieces was a statue of Mary. I designed a corner shelf and dad constructed it out of pine and stained it. It adorned the living room corner for a couple of decades. Often enough mom would find her statue turned to face the wall on such occasions as not winning the lottery, or the Leafs were eliminated from the playoffs. No one would ever admit to doing it. Another of mom's favorite pieces was a mashed potato serving dish with a lid. Unfortunately when we had to clean out the house to sell it. none of us wanted it. It was shaped like a foot and a half potato replete with divots representing eves, and the same dirty brown colour. In truth, it was hideous, and every Christmas, Thanksgiving and Easter it dis-graced the table settings. Last year our confirmation candidates had a wonderful exposure to the art of ceramics by creating their own ceramic cross with the guidance of one of our parishioners who is a master ceramic artist. That same opportunity was graciously extended to the leaders who helped with the confirmation candidates. One Saturday morning we were welcomed into a local studio where we cut out our own cross. In terms of decorations, the sky was the limit - stars, suns, vines, doves, shells, patterns, and textures, all kinds of adornments that made the cross our very own expression. Sometimes imagining the outcome and bringing to bear the vision in one's mind never really plays out the way one might think. Clay can be very temperamental and it can also be very forgiving. In a way it was a very appropriate endeavour as we enter into this Lenten discipline. There is a whole spirituality about being formed out of clay, God as the great potter where everyone is unique and different and beautiful in their own right. There are no mistakes in the rendering, only variations and uniqueness, and the master artist is pleased with the work. The vast difference here is that we are called to be co-creators of the piece of art. Artists often express their pieces in terms of freedom, or releasing the beauty that was already there. That's a perfect definition of Lent, of working diligently to unleash the truth and beauty that the master artist has instilled in the work- to get in



touch with the best part of ourselves that we hide, disguise or are utterly unaware of. So as we embark upon this discipline, use it well. It's not very often that we are given the invitation to reflect and to grow. And one thing our master ceramic artist reminded us, a good glaze covers a multitude of sins.
