

Ruminations

The drive along the 401 between Kingston and the Ontario-Quebec border has to be one of the most boring stretches of highway. I feel sorry for those people who make that trip on a regular basis. It has been over a decade since I made that journey. The pending payoff though made the trip tolerable. I arrived in St. Jean sur Richelieu, the place of my nephew's graduation from basic training after about six hours of driving and checked into my hotel. My brother and sister-in-law arrived later and were at a different hotel - not by design??!! The pavilion where the ceremonies were to take place opened at 12:30 the next day for the 2 pm festivities. I met them there at precisely 12:30 and there was a line-up of other soldiers' families waiting to get the best seats. Now what is a festivity without some hawking? You could pre-purchase a DVD of the ceremonies, or pictures of the event. There were military souvenirs like army water bottles, army t-shirts, army keychains, army cups, army badges nothing for the air force or the navy. It goes without saying we were in army territory. The facility was vast and they piped in military music all the while showing video promotions of basic training life. There were two platoons graduating comprising about 100 young people who successfully completed the course. When a small group of soldiers marched in carrying a stretcher (just in case one of the new graduates happened to pass out from standing motionless for a long time) we knew it was about to begin. A live marching band paraded in the flag and we were all invited to stand. Then the parade master summoned the platoons and everyone stood straining to catch a glimpse of their particular soldier. It is an impressive sight to see over 100 soldiers marching in unison decked out in their dress uniforms with white gloves and white belts carrying their rifles. The thumping of the spit polished boots thundering as one lets you know that are all in step together. My nephew marched out in the third row furthest from us and we were a bit disappointed, though as they reeled around the parade square and lined up for the ceremonies, he ended up in the front row and we had a perfect view of him. He never looked at us and we weren't sure if he knew we were there. They stood motionless at attention eves directed to where they were supposed to be, no flinch no scratching – an impressive feat in itself. We asked him afterward whether he had seen us, and I hope this doesn't reveal any military secrets but he admitted to darting his eyes over to us and so he was proud we were there. The inspection was a bit nerve-racking as the inspecting officer would stop randomly and have a chat. As he continued down the ranks it looked like it would be close. He stopped one before my nephew and we all breathed a sigh of relief. The officer gave a very inspiring and heart-warming address, and welcomed the all into their new family. Then they were paraded off by the military



band, newly minted privates ready for the next stage of their military careers. They certainly know how to do ceremony. Mom and dad would be so proud as we are too, to have a soldier in the family and I think he is pretty proud too, a dream come true for him since grade 6. Fr. Roy

The next *Breaking Open the Word* gathering is: Wednesday, April 3, 2019 @ 7:00 – 8:30 p.m






The CWG will host their annual Family Style Spaghetti dinner on Saturday, April 27th at
