Ruminations

Every once in a while there is talk to setting Easter on a particular weekend in April. Most people don't understand its mobility. Who thinks of the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox anyway? It is interesting that the Easter Vigil is supposed to start after the sun goes down. In fact the rubrics state 'after dark', and there is a whole metaphor related to the imagery of death and darkness and the paschal candle bringing light to darkness. One of the things that never crossed the minds of the liturgical authorities was the northern and southern hemispheres. In the Mediterranean world, there are not the great fluctuations of time. Darkness descends fairly early there as opposed to Ontario, or Northern Canada. Sunset here was 8:06 and darkness is deemed about 20 minutes after sundown. My cousins in northern Alberta were over an hour later, and the poor people in the Yukon 9:45 pm. So a fixed date mightn't be a bad idea. My reasoning isn't so much about the great time differential but rather the availability of exciting flowers for decorating. Christmas is rather easy to do, trees and poinsettias and the latter are rather resilient. They can last the Christmas season even if it is expanded to include the second Epiphany of the baptism of Jesus. Easter lilies are good for two maybe three Sundays, and hydrangeas and just a whole lot of work and so finicky that we curse them every year and wish that there were alternatives. Well this year when we went to pick them up, the hydrangeas were less than adequate but it was late enough in the season to have other plants available for use. That is why this year we have some beautiful mandevillas that can be transplanted outdoors after Easter. When Easter was in March last year, they were just not available, and they are a heck of a lot easier to maintain than the hydrangeas. In fact the mandevillas don't mind a bit of negligence which is my kind of plant. Light levels are always an issue so we leave some of the lights on in the church over night to help maintain them. This year seems to be a big experiment in alternative plants for Easter. Now Easter is liturgical way more important than Christmas (50 days of celebration compared to 12) so that should be reflected in the environment. So when the music ministry does such an exceptional job, and lectors are in fine form, and all the other ministries step up the game to welcome the crowds, those to be initiated and welcomed into our faith, and the liturgies are so unique and special, they all deserve an exciting and inspiring backdrop to express the glory of the events. And one of the



exciting things this year was the first time we had provisions for the overflow of people to comfortably accommodate them in the hall with our closed circuit system where they could participate along with the rest. It was indeed a glorious Triduum and thanks to all our ministries who shone, and thank you to all of you who brought friends and relatives to celebrate with us. God has indeed been praised and glorified. Alleluia! Alleluia!!


