

Ruminations

It seems like it takes just a bit longer each year to recover from the flurry that is Holy Week and the Easter Triduum. On Saturday I took the luxury and went to bed early. Sometimes this means waking up early in the morning, and so Sunday morning I woke up around 4:30 am and lounged in bed until after the 5:00 am news on the radio. I was looking forward to a relaxed easy pace morning - read the paper, do the Sunday crossword, laze through breakfast. watch the sunrise, and open the Church for the Sunday crowds. So I set everything up for morning mass. As I was unlocking the front doors, my key got jammed into the door. No amount of twisting or turning or prying would release it. So a bit of a panic was setting in. That key was the key I need to open almost every door, and I hadn't had breakfast vet, or more tragic, I hadn't showered vet either. So I was standing outside the church doors at 6:20 am. I thought maybe a bit of WD40 would be the trick but alas, the key I needed to open the doors in search of the oil was stuck in the front door. 
