

Ruminations

The day finally arrived when it was time for mom to experience the wonderful science of laser technology. She was going to have her kidney stone blasted to smithereens. There is a pre-procedure protocol that needed to be followed but luckily that was up to the home to ensure she was prepared. I went to pick her up just after 12 noon. She is restricted to a wheel chair. She is far too unsteady and weak to walk. In fact her face still had the vellow colour of healing bruises from falling. She was sitting there and I almost didn't recognize her. They had just done her hair and restyled it. It looked wonderful and so mom looked much fresher than I had seen her in a long time. I signed all the paperwork to take her to the hospital. One of the great things about wheel chairs is ease of movement one would think. Mom however would not keep her feet up on the foot pads and so it was a slow move waiting form mom to shuffle her feet along. One of the workers said it would be easier to take her backwards. It worked. There is a bit of a technique to moving her into the car and the more I have to do it, the easier it is becoming, but it is definitely a two person job. Mom is so good natured in her dementia, usually uttering some gibberish but then smiling or chuckling. There were two issues I had during the almost six and a half hour wait in the waiting room. First, the chairs were horribly uncomfortable. I know the family that sponsors that room and I have informed them that the chairs are awful, and the paint in the room is really dated and needs to be freshened up. The other thing that made the wait torturous was just lack of information. The hospital was not forthcoming with information – no indication of time or procedure. When you did get to talk with someone, they were great. There was no communication about going in to the operating room, no communication when they were finished- no communication when she was wheeled into recovery. The first time I had any word on her was when they came to seek me out to take her home. So four hours of waiting in those torturous chairs was an exercise in patience, listening to phone conversations as people chatted oblivious to all around them. Apparently Mark was cheating on Suzy; grandpa missed his flight home from Florida: and the lady on the phone really didn't want to go to the wedding shower on Saturday. Anyway, mom's procedure went well and as we piled her into the car to take her home, she was cheerful and talkative making no sense until we turned out of the hospital and an OPP



police car was sitting there. Mom said, "There's a cop". I spun to look at my brother shocked at this little moment of lucidity. If dementia reverts to the early years, we wondered if this was a hint of untold stories of an ill spent youth.
