



I won a CBC coffee cup a number of years ago by answering a couple of trivia questions on one of the afternoon talk shows. They were interviewing Greg Joy who won a silver medal in high jump at the Montreal Olympics and so all the trivia revolved around the modern day Olympics. The Olympics were my passion and one of the primary reasons I decided to study Sports Administration. As long as I was talking to the radio host I was fine. It helped that he had been a high school classmate at Newmarket High who went off to study journalism.
