Ruminations

My grade 8 graduation happened a couple of years ago, ok, maybe several years ago, ok, four and a half decades ago. That was the last graduation that I attended, though we had a grade twelve graduation ceremony but it was rather small and understated. Most of us were already in grade thirteen. My real high school graduation or convocation as we referred to it took place in November. I was already away at university and if the truth be told, I knew I would have more fun staying in residence than trying to make my way back from Sudbury to Newmarket. There was an inevitability for the graduation so it didn't seem like such a big deal. The same held true for my university graduation. It was a long way to go to sit for hours with people I didn't know (because graduations were done by programs and not by residences so there was only one other person from my program that I knew) so one day at the end of June a package arrived from Laurentian University, the anticipated degree. When I opened it, it was the wrong person. I got on the phone and called the Registrar's Office to try to sort it out. They were not that cooperative. She insisted that I must have picked up someone else's degree at one of the after grad parties. For whatever reason she couldn't comprehend that I hadn't attended. It took a while but she finally understood. It was a month later when my degree finally arrived. I'm not sure where it is now though. When graduating from the seminary, I happily missed it. The night before the big event, I severely sprained my ankle playing volleyball with some teachers. The ankle still has not been repaired all these years later. My last graduation was from the University of Notre Dame. I definitely was not making the eight hour trip to receive a piece of paper, even if it was an authentic sheepskin. That one I have in my office for self defense reasons. I was the first grandson to graduate high school and then university. Well, this week it is the turn of the next generation. My niece is graduating from a program called "cognitive studies". I think that is the name of it. It is one of the nine convocations that York is hosting this spring. My brother had graduated from York in philosophy and his program was hosted out of the Glendon campus. I remember mom and dad going to it and sitting there for hours as the ceremony unfolded – all in French. They were not impressed. They had no warning that such would be the case. I don't think mom and dad even knew how to swear in French. It was a scorching hot June afternoon. They were not too happy when I opted not to go to my university graduation two years earlier, but when they grumbled



about the graduation in French, I reminded them that Laurentian was a bilingual university and at least half, if not more of my graduation would be in French too. So their hostility abated. For my brother's sake, I hope my niece's grad is in English.


