

## **Ruminations** ....

One of the annual July activities that I dreaded each year was the week we would spend out at the farm with my aunts (grandaunts to be more precise). Even then I was a home body and spending time with these old sisters of my grandmother allowed me to hone my creative juices as I tried to find any and all excuses not to have to go. The highlight for my aunts was their annual summer tea party where all the old retired farmers would come over and sit around chatting, sipping and munching. Our job was to ensure that the trays were distributed often and if needing to be filled, the delectable goodies were replenished. For this event we four boys were always gifted with a new outfit, pink shirts, navy shorts and beige socks, and we were to don them for the event much like prison outfits. Luckily for me these two old aunts were terrible at sizing me and I never had to wear the pink shirt or shorts, just the beige socks. One would think that after a couple of years these two school teachers would have figured it out to size up for me. Thankfully they didn't. Fifty years ago my parents had arrived a day or two early as it was one of the aunt's birthday. It just happened to coincide with the moon landing and first walk on the surface. Remember there was no cable back then and the television signal was dependent on a television aerial. The black and white television set at the farm was not very good and the reception at best was grainy and sporadic. There was a contraption attached to the aerial that adjusted the prongs atop the 30 foot structure so that the signals could be focused for better reception. As the moon walk was pending that control apparatus was spun this way and that trying for the best picture, to no avail. I still remember sitting on the carpeted floor with all the adults in various positions on the sectional sofa. In our house we would have been munching on popcorn, but at the farm, 'one did not eat in the living room, one ate in the dining room'. They obviously didn't know how to watch Hockey Night in Canada! The living room faced south with a huge window that looked out over the front field recently planted with evergreens – a farmer tax incentive program. It happened that we could see the moon as this momentous event took place. I'm not sure if we realized the historical magnitude of this marvel. I vaguely remember discussions amongst the young ones there about whether or not the astronaut



would get stuck in the cheese, and at times staring out the window at the moon convinced that we could almost see the space capsule with our bare eyes. I can't always remember where I was or what I did last week, let alone fifty years ago, but I remember that night so vividly.
