

It is so hard to believe how quickly the summer has passed by. The first day back to school was always recounting about what we did during the summer. Well, here it goes. Although the Office was on summer hours and bulletins were published once a month, and although schools were on vacation and most of the organizations took a summer hiatus, there was lots going on. The kitchen saga continues. Plans are afoot to repair the damage from the flood back in May. Insurance claims have been submitted and permission to proceed has been granted. Yay, the kitchen is getting a new counter top and maybe even a new refrigerator. We are asking the Knights and the CWG to spearhead this project and over the next year or so to raise money to get this done. Finally we removed the shower doors, in my bathroom, that were filled with moldy caulking and temporarily hung shower curtains. After the first shower I



decided I needed to get a grab bar to exit the tub safely. Of course I took some ribbing from my brothers. Being the oldest they are more than happy to remind me that in just over half a year I will be hitting the big 6-0. I just say that all that number means is I am smart enough to know what I need, and wise enough not to be worried about what the young ones are laughing at. It goes on to offer the invitation, "if appropriate, during the period of sacred silence after communion' they may sit. This means that the place for private prayer or devotion is this small period before the final prayer. Any other time diminishes the sign of our unity. If able, please remain standing during the communion rite until everyone has come to the table.
