## **Ruminations** ....

People often question how I ever made the jump from sports administration to priesthood. It seems like a humungous leap. But I was aspiring to work for the Olympic committees with the same ideals that the Games had at their origin – the pursuit of excellence, truth and beauty. So it's not such a foreign notion as priesthood. Well certainly the Olympics have straved very far from those purist ideals as sports has in general. It was with double vision that I read about the festivities surrounding our newest tennis phe-nom, the young teenager from Mississauga who won the American Tennis Open. I don't remember her name, but she was a very determined young athlete that bodes well for the Olympic Games next year. As they offered her the key to the city, and her own parade, and a street named after her, something seemed a little off kilter. I found it curious that this feat, no matter how impressive, warranted the celebrations. Even the prime minister got involved (I am sure it had nothing to do with the up-coming election). It was unsettling because this momentous win actually didn't make my life better, or our town healthier, or our province more compassionate, or our country more generous, or our world more peaceful. I admit there may be corollary benefits, and some young people might be inspired, and getting involved in physical activity is a good thing, but in the big picture it plays out as an entertaining interlude. So I pondered about people, unsung people, behind the scenes heroes who have made the world better. In my own life, I think of the outstanding nurses who tend to my mother in the hospital, or the workers in the nursing home who tend to her each and every day. I have watched teachers and educational assistants tending with severe autistic children, working and celebrating I have witnessed family members almost imperceptible progress. tending to the needs of family members dying of cancer. I watched a wonderful police officer deal incredibly patiently with an elderly person who had just driven over a lampstand in a parking lot and was confused and lost. The young Swedish girl championing climate change actions, or even her mother who has effectively giving up her opera singing career so as not to travel by plane to reduce her carbon footprint. I think we all know wonderful ordinary people who do extraordinary things. Now I have to admit that I love the Olympics even if they have been tainted by money and drugs and politics. And I am thrilled that Mitch Marner has re-signed with the Leafs, but as a matter of perspective, where are our values as a society? The billions of dollars spent on sports and entertainment (which are not bad in and of themselves), strikes me as skewed priorities to the detriment of our world. Certainly much of world poverty could be alleviated, the devastation of the Bahamas could be aided, the problem of homelessness could be reduced, the destruction of Rain Forests could be stopped, and the list goes on. I'm happy the Mississauga girl excelled and is reaching for the stars, and I congratulate her, but there are many more hidden people deserving of her accolades



and so much more, who also deserve streets named after them, and keys to towns and cities given to them, and parades in honour of them. The world is in need of her dedication and determination, but sport is for life, not life for sport. Fr. Roy






## **CWG NEWS**
