

I guess the fondest memories of thanksgiving involved a house smelling of fresh cooked turkey and homemade apple pies. I still salivate remembering mom's garlic mashed potatoes and especially her dressing. For me, the highlight of the thanksgiving feast was always the dressing, and I gladly accepted the responsibility of breaking down the slices of bread to make sure there would be enough. Even those efforts were not sufficient as the only thing that was guaranteed to be totally eaten- to have no left overs was the dressing, that was until she changed her recipe – one of those profound mysteries as to why and which I hope someday to be able to forgive her - someday. As time went on the luster of the time investment became too energy demanding and mom came up with a great idea- our thanksgiving switched from turkey to Chinese food. Mom would type out a menu and drop it off the day before the big event to Dragon King in Holland Landing. That was a pretty easy and fun way of gathering together. Since mom has fallen into dementia it seems that our thanksgiving gatherings are trying to find its format. Last year we tried a Monday brunch at the Buttery. The Buttery was a favorite for mom and dad was it seemed like a fitting venue. That seemed to be the routine of choice again for this year, but as the arrangements were underway, the plans got sidetracked. The question arose about the menu for the brunch. There needed to be a great variety to accommodate a vegan and a gluten allergy. My vote was still for the Buttery but it became apparent that not everyone would be able to join us and the intent of gathering us all would be in jeopardy. The criteria for gathering was that it had to be quick, easy to prepare and minimal effort to clean up. So my sister-in-law suggested a light lunch of finger foods. It helps to have a nephew in chef school and so the menu evolved into a charcuterie platter. Now it certainly is a difficult word to pronounce but it was absolutely delicious. So we stood and sat around the kitchen island with a wonderful assortment of meats and cheeses, and bacon with homemade croissants. There were little bowls olives and hummus, and lots of other such foods that I wouldn't eat so I really don't remember what they were. And then you could also take a seat at the dining room table to engage in quieter conversation. It was a great way to gather. There was freedom of movement, very few dishes and lots of engaging. No one had to get up at 4:30 in the morning to put the turkey in the oven, or peel a bag of potatoes or cut beans. And when you had your fill of food and conversations it was a guilt-free



departure. I can see this being a workable format for Christmas and Easter. No muss no fuss.
