

Ruminations....

Twice a year all the priests of the archdiocese gather at Nottawasaga Inn in Alliston, once in May and once in October. The Spring gathering is the annual retreat. Each priest is obliged to participate in a seven day retreat every year. Although the Nottawasaga gathering runs from Monday evening until Thursday lunch, for most of the priests that suffices as the retreat. Some priests who have the luxury of a second priest in the parish are able to swing a longer and more spiritual version of the retreat at a place a little more austere than a nice hotel complete with swimming pool, indoor mini golf course and a patio door and Alas, for the rest of us, Alliston fulfills our duty if not spiritually, at least canonically. The Fall gathering is our annual professional upgrade or seminar. Usually there is a theme for professional development but in reality I think it is more about getting together for social and friendship renewal. There are so many priests in the archdiocese that these events are spread over two weeks with half attending the first and half attending the second. With the rhythm of the annual cycle, it is possible to not see friends for years until the choice of week one or week two synch. This past seminar had a grand total of 175 priests most of whom I swear I have never seen before. The reality of our diocese, in fact our country is that we are mission territory. We are no longer inspiring young people to enter into religious life to sustain the Church in Canada. It is a sad state of affairs from a couple of generations ago when so many young people were entering the seminary and there was a glut of new priests each year. Most of the priests are borrowed from around the world. This reality is most evident at our annual priest gatherings. In North America most families discourage young people from even considering a vocation into religious life. Anyway, this year's content for our seminar was better than the recent years and there was lots of things to ponder. The theme was "pastoral notes on sacraments and sacramental" highly practical stuff. The hinge of the events generally are the meal times. Breakfast is a free for all. You can make your own way to the breakfast buffet between 6:30 am until 8:30 am. The few stalwart early risers are usually waiting of the doors to open, not just because that is the freshest food of the day, but because you can dine and dash – get in there and fuelled up for the rest of the day, and for myself, I can get in and out quick and back to my room because I usually have a book on the go. This time I was reading Trevor Noah's "Born a Crime". Lunch is buffet style and it is at a designated time, 175 priests crowding and pushing and shoving in the line to make sure that you can sit at a table with people you know and to be able to avoid being stuck with the bishops. Table roulette is a very popular game. Finally our dinners are sit down affairs where we are served more formally. It is the same menu each year. Fortunately it tastes good, except for the zucchini and cauliflower on the second night. On the Wednesday, lots of people sign out and head off to other



venues. This year a few of us found our way to a delicious little place in Creemore called Chez Michel. It is a nice break from the swarming priests, and a chance to re-engage. Six more months until our May outing. Fr. Roy
