## **Ruminations** ....

Just before ordination, the priest personnel director invites you for a little chat about the future life as a priest, what kind of ministry you would like or not like. My conversation I assume was pretty basic - I would love a parish with lots of schools and no hospital. After a stint at St. Michael's Hospital I knew that it was definitely not my strong suit and a glaring weakness. Coupled with my experiences with the many episodes with my dad, I knew hospital ministry would be the death of my priesthood. When the time came to move from Ajax, again the personnel director asked about various options, would I like to try non-parish based ministry? Or other things? I said no, parish ministry is good as long as there is no hospital ministry involved. Apparently that fell on deaf ears. So since I have arrived here, the four local parishes share a beeper. The hospital ministry actually belongs by geography to St. John's, but a sense of co-operative ministry exists so the others are on board to help out St. John's. This was my suggestion, and each priest takes the beeper for a week at a time, 24/7. At the time the three other parishes had two priests so they kept the dreaded beeper for two weeks. I would love to see the statistics on calls because more often than not, the other parishes would receive at most a couple of calls over the two weeks. Usually when I get it for the one week, you need two hands to count the number of calls. This past week, I had seven calls, and at the time of writing this, I still have a day with it. The fear of the beeper going off kind of becomes consuming and I certainly don't sleep as deeply. Honestly the number of calls in the middle of the night have been minimal over the eight and a half years. It is funny when it goes off, because there is always the first reaction of unpleasant thoughts and words and the poor operators that call from the call centre usually get the brunt of my passive aggressive curtness and annovance. So I brace myself and make my way to Southlake. Over the years it is more unusual if there is no connection with the sick person and their family. As we chat, inevitably if they are local there will be some frame of reference either mutual friends or school connections. The seventh call this week though was a wonderful experience despite my protestations about the beeper going off vet again. It was a stroke victim who was very much aware and talkative knowing that the bleeding in the brain meant that time was limited and quickly passing. She talked of seeing someone waiting for her and she was unafraid. During the anointing of the sick, as the more than twenty family and friends came to lay on hands and add a little prayer, she took each individual, said something personal and blessed them. It went on for a while, but when I finished my humble little ritual, she offered a blessing for all those who were present. It is not the usual way the liturgy is to unfold, but I reflected on how privileged we were to watch the encroaching death be dealt with such grace and courage. Without the sacramental anointing and the



opportunity afforded by the laying on of hands, few of those present would have had the one on one opportunity. It was liturgy at its best, and in the midst of a side occasion brought joy and comfort to those in need. We were blessed by her words and by her example. Vaya con Dios. P.S. 
