Ruminations....

The good news is that my rash was not caused by apples, nor any other food. I finally went to the walk in clinic where they eliminated a food allergy and shingles as a cause. The doctor prescribed a steroid cream that she threatened me not to allow it to touch any skin but the affected area for fear that it thins the skin. My thought was to rub in over my stomach in the hopes that... never mind. I knew I was going to see my doctor within a week or two so I opted not to use it and wait for his second opinion. His second opinion was to send me to a dermatologist. So a week later I was off to Oak Ridges Medical Clinic which was exciting because it was literally around the corner from where my mother grew up- not that the area has any resemblance to visits to grandma's house. The office was on the fourth floor and as I found the number I thought I was in the wrong place. It was posh. It was more like a salon on Rodeo drive. There was inviting subdued lighting, and shelves of beauty and dermatological products creatively displayed. The staff must be used to confused patients visiting for the first time because they immediately welcomed me in and asked for my health card. She handed me a clipboard with a pen attached and led me to the waiting room furnished with a television and coffee bar. As much as it seemed hospitable, I assumed that it was to disguise the long wait to see the doctor. I settled in to fill out the two page form and I barely got my name written when I was called to see the doctor. I protested a bit saying I haven't finished filling out the form but I was assured that I could fill it out after the appointment. No sooner had I sat down when this 'teenage' doctor entered introducing himself. I can't remember his name because I was expecting him to say "Doogie Howser". He must have started medical school upon graduating senior kindergarten. So he picked up a special flashlight and started looking at the rashes. He said the remnants of the one on the arms looks like eczema. Then he looked at the legs and torso and said they looked like psoriasis. He went on to explain the difference about two branches of the immune system and if it is manifested from the one branch it is eczema and if from the other psoriasis. I apparently suffer from the heartbreak of psoriasis. The reference was lost on him. Kids! He then asked to see my finger nails. After the posh reception room I thought I might be getting a manicure. He then asked me about something that may have triggered it as he thinks it is stressed related. I told him the only thing I can think of is the recent losing streak of the Toronto Maple leafs. He thought that was unlikely. I showed him the cream prescribed by the walk in clinic and he said it was too mild and so he prescribed a spray that I have to use once a day for four weeks with



two repeats because I may need more spray because of the vastness of the rash. I was done and returned to the waiting room to complete my form, and then handed it in at the posh reception desk where they handed me my prescription. In all, it took me longer to find a parking spot than to complete my appointment. Fr. Roy


