Ruminations....

As the saving goes, "The best laid plans of mice and men often go awry." The pretty much sums up every year in our preparations for the Christmas season. Most often planning begins in the preliminary stages in September, especially for the outdoor stuff, namely the lights for the trees out front and on the roof. Every year we say we will do it while the weather is still warm and the lighting is easy. Every year when we pass October we say that the next warm day we will mount the lights and be done with it. Every year when November passes we lament that we didn't do it earlier and we swear that next year we will do it in October. October seems just a tad early for such Then November is rather busy with the Bazaar and the various Santa Clause parades and the weather is always unpredictable. Here it is, we are entering the third week of Advent and now we are braving the elements to get the job done. We tried last week but as luck would have it, there was just too much snow accumulated into big drifts on the roof. It was too dangerous to venture near roof edges. Last vear we got smart and instead of needing to lug the containers of lights up and down the roof access or ladders, we purchased weather tight containers and stored the lights and their paraphernalia on the roof. They rested there comfy and cozy through the summer and fall, just waiting to be sprung from their hibernation, whenever that might be. The LED Christmas bulb is a wonderful invention. It means that we can connect of the many, many strands of lights it takes to outline the building and illuminate the trees without blowing a circuit and sending the rest of Newmarket into darkness. Now the elaborate nature of the nativity scenes set up also requires some fancy coordination. The structure itself takes a lot of planning, hauling the cinderblock bases, the felt bottoms for the cinderblocks, the chimney tiles, the shelving units, the undershelf lights, the backdrop, the poles and cross poles, and that's hours of work before we even start to pull the nativity sets themselves out of storage and begin to assembly them. As a liturgist, as much as I don't like most of this being done during the Advent season, the practicality of it means I have to swallow my distaste for it. The trees will likely be erected after the final mass on the fourth Sunday of Advent which appeases my liturgical sensibilities concerning the nativities. Plus, it is a lot less time consuming than trying to do it all at once on the last Sunday. Our nativity display fame has reached the upper echelons of the Archdiocese. I have received a request from the official



Archdiocese blogger to interviewed about the display and supply pictures. I'm having my agent negotiate with them. I can't really remember exactly how many we have but I know it is over 80. I guess I will know by the time this is published. It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas. Fr. Roy


