

Ruminations

February was always a fun time at university. Being in Sudbury, there was always lots of snow and lots of cold weather. On those cold, clear days, if the wind was blowing in the right direction, you could smell the paper mill in Espanola over 70 kilometers away. Of course in a university environment, one did not need a huge excuse to have a party, and certainly with the French influence as a bilingual university, a winter carnival, complete with the Laurentian version of Bonhomme this celebration of all things winter was a big deal. It was always a treat to walk to class through the plaza by the library tower and see the various snow sculptures coloured with splashes of water paints. One of the highlights of Carnival was the ball hockey tournament between the residences and the various schools. The engineering and sports administration school always had good teams, both in the men's and women's divisions. My residence kind of had a marked advantage. Every vear, Frère Viau would erect our outdoor rink, with boards and lights for playing at night. Our residence had a league throughout the winter and the schedule of games usually began Sunday afternoons after Mass. Each floor had a meeting in September to devise a name for the floor and purchase hockey sweaters with a custom designed crest that were worn throughout the year, but that were meant for ball hockey season. People would crowd around the windows at the end of the halls to watch the play from the comfort of a warm building. Teams were always looking for an advantage on the ice. There were strategies that included spraying the soles of the running shoes with spray starch, or wrapping big elastic bands around the toes of the shoe, or buying a specific brand of running shoe that seems to provide a bit better grip on the slippery surface. In the end, nothing overcame sheer determination and grit, and the ability to weather the cold. There were some very cold days, but the league must go on. Often times there was a pick-up game happening during the weekday evenings, and it was a wonderful way to confront the season. The winter carnival always concluded with a dance in the Grand Salon. Most residences had their own parties throughout the year so this was a rare time when the whole campus came together, and being a rather small campus most attendees where at least remotely familiar. The ball hockey champions were crowned, usually our residence, and a good time was had by all. The other highlight of February was reading week, a time when it seemed the whole campus evacuated. I remember one year leaving the campus with a balmy temperature of minus thirty degrees Celsius, riding the bus to Barrie and seeing that the temperature at the bus depot was a relative tropical minus one. I expected it to feel like Florida but when I disembarked, a chill ran through me, it was such a damp cold that I much preferred the polar weather to the frigid, humid south. Reading week marked the beginning of the countdowns- the countdown to Easter break; the countdown to exams and the end of the year; and the countdown until Spring, which was always

marked by the slow demise of the carnival snow sculptures and pools of coloured water. Happy Groundhog Day.






