Ruminations

The last meeting of the Catholic Women's Guild had a guest speaker. It was a police officer giving a presentation on various safety topics like phone scams and what to look for to make sure you don't fall prey to them. Not as easy as it sounds because as he said, these scammer are really good at their craft. The constable admitted that even his own parents, with all the warnings that he has given them, became victims of a conniving schemer. There was lots of wonderful information and tidbits on how to protect yourself in this age of multimedia traffic. The one that really hit home for me was his exploration of what we keep in our wallets, well since it was the CWG he made reference to what we keep in our purses, but I don't have a purse, only a wallet so I made the assumption that I could relate it to my wallet. He began by asking how many of us keep our social insurance card in the wallets. Most people did, me included. He then asked how often in the last year we had ever had to use it, present it, or quote from it. I can't think of the last time I had to draw it out for information, besides, I remember what the number is anyway. Even if it is required information on some government form, I recite it by heart. In fact, since my brother and I received ours at the same time well over 50 years ago for hockey registration, I remember his too. He then went on to explain how dangerous it is carrying it around because if it is ever lost, the difficulty of re-establishing one's identity because of a lost social insurance card is depressingly difficult. I must confess that I never really thought about that. His solution was incredibly simple - take it out of the wallet immediately and store it in some safe location, a strongbox in the house or a safety deposit box in the bank. I intended to do just that but first I have to purchase a strongbox. I know that if I just place it in a safe location, I will inevitably forget where that location was when such a time arose that I would require it. The number of times I have had to dig through drawers and containers in my office, or the rectory or the drawers in my bedroom are solid evidence that I need to devise a workable strategy to locate at least some of the important documentation of my life – passport, social insurance card, my final will and testimony, information about my bank accounts, a picture of my favorite nephew or niece, but he knows who that is, and of course, my 1989 ski pass for Blue Mountain which has, in estimation, the best picture of myself



that I have ever taken. But I think the best and most exciting advice that the police officer gave was that whenever someone is on the phone asking for personal information, or schemes that seem too good to be true, or money, even with threats of police crashing down your doors because your taxes are in arrears, just say NO! I can't wait for my nieces or nephews to call asking for money for school or something (not that they ever have) I will just say no. So now I am off shopping for a strongbox for my valuables. Fr. 
