

Ruminations

It was a rather up and down week - not emotionally, but certainly physically. With life swinging back into full swing, the Parish Hall was in full use. Every night this week there was something happening. Between parents' information meetings and parents' catechesis meetings, every day tables needed to be taken down, or round tables replaced with rectangle tables, either six foot or eight foot, or combinations of each, and chairs stacked and wheeled away, or taken out and put around the tables. With the shadow of Covid still around, we place only six chairs instead of the regular eight chair numbers. As a bit of a math nerd, that means that for every three tables we would normally set up, now we have to add an extra table. I have noticed that those tables and stacks of chairs are getting heavier and heavier, and more difficult to maneuver. One of the things that has irked me is the amount of gum that people have stuck underneath them. It is disgusting. So we spend over four hours trying to scrape that hardened gum off the bottoms. I investigated, on-line, about purchasing cheap DNA tests to track down the culprits who perpetrated this crime inducing profanity. At this time, there are no home tests to who discover who these perps are. And who knew there were so many different colours of gum? Anyway, one of the big activities in the Hall this past week and this up coming week, the making of ceramic crosses. A few years ago, as part of our Confirmation program, we had a great addition to the candidates' preparation. We are fortunate to have a wonderful ceramic artist and potter in the parish, and she generously offers her time and talent to help our students get in touch with another side of the brain. They are invited to create their own ceramic cross as an expression of their hopes and dreams, their beliefs, and their identity – a very spiritual and worthwhile exercise. And I think to their credit, many of these young people discover that they have an artistic, creative side that they never knew existed. There are a lot of very talented young people and it is inspiring to see their work unfold, and those creative juices activating. And from personal experience, I know that even the not so artistic editions of crosses, once they receive their final glazes which adds vibrant colour and life, turn out impressive. It seems that the glazes cover a multitude of sins. The raw clay that has been shaped into the cross is just the beginning. These clay models are fired in a kiln at high temperatures. If you are interested in money making, by shares in Newmarket Hydro, especially around people who have these electric kilns in their homes. Two weeks later, our young people return for the second session and the completion of their art pieces. Once the colour glazes have been added, the crosses are again fired in the kiln. When they are all ready, we are going to display them at the front of the Church as we bless them and then the candidates take them home as a wonderful reminder of their spiritual journey to Confirmation. Every Parish should have a resident ceramic artist.

And you can be sure that when we take the tables down for the next activity, we check for gum stuck under the table, and since we know who sat where, if their cross happens to be 'accidently' dropped, God's will be done.




